In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 20 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Central Government is pleased to declare the following sites near Nala Sopara in Bassein Taluka of the Thana District, Bombay Presidency, to be protected areas, namely:-

Village.	Name and description of the site.	Boundaries of the sites.
1. Gas	A mound locally known as "Sonar Bhat" in Hissa No.11 of the Survey No.52, having an area of 25½ gunthas.	North- Survey No.51 and tank. East - Survey Nos.51 and 52. South- Survey No.51. West - Survey No.53 and cart track leading to Sopara village.
2. Bolinj	A tank by the west side of the road from Umraia village to Bolinj.	North- Survey No.274 of Bolinj. East - Road to Bolinj village. South- Survey No. 149 of Umraia village. West - Survey No.149 of Umraia and Survey No.274 of Bolinj.
Mardas.	A mound locally known as Burud Kot in Hissa No.2 of Survey No. 75 having an area of 2 acres and 28½ gunthas.	North- Cart track from Wagholi to Sopara. East - Survey No. 75. South- Survey No.77. West - Hissa No.1 of Survey No. 75.
