

difficulties in the matter of recruiting. I have consequently decided that the time has now arrived when no further increase of the civil side of the service can be allowed, and when a strong effort should be made to reduce it by gradually extending the employment of civil medical practitioners recruited in India.

4. Your Excellency's Government will consider what appointments can best be filled in this way. If there should be any particular posts requiring special qualifications, for which suitable persons, whether trained in Indian colleges or holding European medical degrees, be they European, Eurasian, or Indian, cannot be obtained in India, it will be necessary to seek candidates from this country.

5. When it is found impossible to obtain a man from outside the Indian Medical Service to fill a particular new civil appointment, or one which has not previously been so filled, I will not object for the present to that service being drawn upon; but the vacancy so caused must be filled from outside it, i. e., no appointment must be made in succession which would involve an addition to the cadre of the Indian Medical Service.

No. 2704-B.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Ancient Monuments Preservation Act, 1904 (VII of 1904), the Governor in Council is pleased to make the following rules, viz. :—

1. These rules are applicable to the areas in the Nasik District described below, namely :—

(1) *Aeshwar's Temple situated in Survey No. 1281 of the village of Sinnar, and the area comprised in the said survey number bounded as follows :—*

North—Saraswati river, beyond that Survey Nos. 1250 and 1249.

West—Survey No. 1251.

South—Nasik-Sinnar Road, beyond that Survey Nos. 1277 and 1280.

East—Survey No. 1282.

(2) *The "Shri Mahadeo" Hemadpanti Temple at Zodga, taluka Mdligaon, and the area which is included within the space of 200 feet on every side and from the corners of the said temple which is situated in Revision Survey No. 426 at Zodga.*

(3) *The Ankai Caves and the Hillocks comprised in Forest No. 340 of Ankai village, bounded as follows :—*

North—Survey Nos. 218, 223, 214, 225, 226, 232, 233, 239 and the boundary of the village of Wanjarwadi.

North—Survey Nos. 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 2, 1, village site and Survey Nos. 173, 174, 175, 179 and 139.

West—Survey Nos. 215, 216 and 217.

East—Hill of Survey No. 240 and the boundary of the village of Malegaon.

(4) *The Pandu Lena Caves and Hillock comprised in Forest No. 266 of the village of Pathardi and the space round about bounded as follows :—*

North—Survey Nos. 285, 287, 288, 280, 281, 235, 236, 237 and 238 of Pathardi.

East—Survey Nos. 239 to 249.

South—Survey Nos. 250 and 251.

West—Survey Nos. 267 to 272, and 284.

(5) *The Godeshwar Mahadeo Temple with the land and compound occupied by it in Survey No. 1 of the village of Sinnar and all land within 100 yards of the temple's outer wall.*

2. No person shall within any of the said areas make any sort of excavation whatever, except under a license from the Collector of the district, which will generally not be granted except so far as such excavation may be deemed necessary for the repair or improvement or protection of the temple or caves in question.

3. Any person committing a breach of the above rule shall be punishable with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees.
